What is a Scenic Road?

A Scenic Road is a road which is designated by a town or government agency for the preservation of natural resources, aesthetics, and public safety and under the provisions of Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 40, Section 15c. (http://www.mass.gov/legis/laws/mgl/40-15c.htm)
