Sewer Construction Update

Chatham – Robert B. Our Co., and Lawrence Lynch Co. have resumed work related to the sewer construction project begun last spring. Work this fall involves roadway restoration/paving and general cleanup/restoration and will take place over several weeks, weather permitting.

Work for the week of November $5^{th} - 9^{th}$:

Monday/Tuesday- clean up, cut keyways, adjust castings

Wednesday – Friday – installation of top course of paving on the following roads in order:

Absegami Run/Oyster Bluff

Oyster Pond Furlong

Oyster Pond Lane

Jane's Way

Earle's Way

The Cornfield

Wheldon Way

Shattuck Place

Work for the week of November $12^{th} - 16^{th}$:

*Tuesday/Wednesday – installation of top course of paving on inlet Road and Spinnaker Lane. (*may occur at the end of the previous week if progress allows)

Roads will be passable at the end of each day. Police Details and Contractors will work with residents to ensure their needs for access are addressed.

Lawn restoration, etc. will take place following the top course of paving.

Police Details and signage will be in-place to assist motorists in reaching their destination.

Normal work hours are 7 AM to 5:00 PM Monday to Friday, weather permitting.
