As a reminder, please don't forget the National Moment of Remembrance. The Moment, established by Congress, asks Americans to pause in an act of national unity for a duration of one minute at 3 pm.

3 pm was chosen because it is the time when most Americans are enjoying their freedoms on this national holiday. The Moment is not designed to replace traditional Memorial Day events. Instead, it is an act of national unity in which all Americans, alone or with family and friends, pause for one minute to honor those who died in service to our country.
